Ilham Mohamed was a digital navigator at MMRTI over the summer. She helped create a film on digital access. Here's what Mohamed has to say about making the film:

While we interviewed different people for our film, we learned that digital inequity has always been an issue waiting for a resolve. There were multiple problems that were present in the Yesler Terrace community. While the city worked to provide for the community, language barriers held them from gaining access to the resources provided. Covid-19 only worked to highlight these already present difficulties and only added more stress for the families.

Parents of younger children had it tough when trying to help their young ones with no experience in digital literacy. Children belonging to families of refugees, were given the responsibility to look after the younger siblings when it came to navigating the online school. As if the burden wasn't enough, students felt suffocated in their household with poor internet connection and barely enough space to continue their work. Teachers who were forced to switch to an unusual learning environment had it especially tough with very limited resources for them to adequately teach their students.

And although all these issues aren't completely solved, we found the community's resilience towards them incredible and motivating enough to create a film about them.

Ikram Mohamed talks about her summer work with MMRTI and the documentary they created about the impact of Covid-19:

What I learned from making this documentary with my peers is the overwhelming theme of loss. There was a massive loss of connection the community of Yesler Terrace faced during the Covid-19 pandemic. Everyone from the elders to children struggled with loneliness. No one was going out to see each other.

I also learned about the importance of teamwork. Working alongside six other interns, we needed to communicate and work together to make this film happen. We needed to work together to create a documentary that represented the community of Yesler Terrace.

This internship was very insightful and essential for all students to partake in this internship. We learned how to use a camera, filmmaking, photography, teamwork, leadership, using our voice, giving back to the community, and so much more. I am glad I had the opportunity to intern at MMRTI.
