Yesler Youth Media

Multimedia Resources and Training Institute (MMRTI)'s main goal is to equip families and their kids with the knowledge and equipment needed to succeed in remote learning.

For eight weeks this summer, a group of teenagers brought together by MMRTI in partnership with Seattle University created virtual learning for kids at Yesler Terrace. The youth were taught many skills such as: videography, photography, editing and storyboarding.

The youth media group covered a lot of themes and math concepts. For example, one film for kids K-2nd grade was about addition and subtraction. The group used a soccer ball for the lesson – counting how many kicks were made. Another film, also for little kids, was about shapes, patterns, and symmetry and Yesler Terrace served as the classroom. For the older kids (3rd – 4th grades), the film's narrative involved a trip to QFC to buy ingredients to make brownies. All together Yesler Youth Media created eight math videos. And, they even translated two of them into Oromo, Tigrigna, and Amharic! These films were presented to the families at Yesler Terrace.
